At **Clubhouse** it is important that students have the time to structure their own afternoon. This is a place where they can talk with friends, get help completing their homework and play. Whether creating an original art project, striving for victory in a card or board game, energetically playing a few rounds of four square, or just quietly reading a book, the **Clubhouse** is designed to be a relaxing and stress-free environment.

Each day, faculty are there to lend a hand with schoolwork and offer a multitude of ideas for how to spend the afternoon. They will lead projects, as well as engage children in making good decisions, keeping positive relationships, and overcoming obstacles.

Clubhouse Workshops

Session 1

SEPTEMBER - OCTOBER

Monday - Dodgeball, K-Grade 4

Children enjoy dodgeball because it's informal, fun and easy to play. Come improve your gross motor skills and learn how to react quickly to constantly changing game situations. It promotes agility and quick movements. Learn teamwork, the importance of keeping your eye on the ball at all times, throwing, catching and aiming.

(7 weeks - \$284)

Tuesday - Rock Climbing at MetroRock, K-Grade 8

Beginners: Newer/younger climbers will learn the fundamentals of belaying and work on climbing skills.

Advanced: For those who have taken the class previously, we will progress the skills they have learned. We will both work on more advanced climbing techniques and also incorporate more activity based options like repelling and speed climbing.

(8 weeks - \$478)

Wednesday - Guard Up, Story Arc, Grades 2-4

Live the adventure and become the hero you've always known you could be with Guard Up's Guardian Adventures! Leap into action as the age old tale of good versus evil comes alive. Combining STEM Education, informal learning, and live action role play, the heroes use their

creativity and newly found knowledge to overcome the obstacles on their epic path. It's up to you to vanquish the villain, save the day, and restore order to the realm!

(5 weeks - \$348, this is a 90 minute workshop)

Thursday - Color Challenge, K-Grade 1

Participants are divided into teams, each of which is assigned a color. Teams will choose different commanders each day and compete against each other in challenges and events to earn points. Some examples of team challenges include Castle Ball, Omnikin Poison, Torch Ball, Survivor™ Games, Amazing Race™ Challenges, and Geocaching. It will conclude with one event that can propel any team forward to claim the crown!

Friday - Flag Football, K-Grade 4

This is the perfect opportunity for you to "try" no-contact football, to enhance your current football skills, and truly learn the game. We will learn the fundamental skills of football, with an emphasis on participation, teamwork and good sportsmanship.

Session 2

NOVEMBER - DECEMBER

Monday - Chess Wizards, K-Grade 4

Come learn lessons and traditional gameplay. We will incorporate variations of chess games that build teamwork and foster a genuine enjoyment of the game.

(6 weeks - \$278)

Tuesday - Art with Pam, K-Grade 1

Explore the world of art with fun, challenging projects that help you see the world in a new way. Mixed media, 3-D, portrait murals, lettering and design are just a few of the projects we create with Pam Shanley!

(7 weeks - \$284)

Tuesday - Sewing with Zoya, Grades 2-4

This course will provide a young designer with basic knowledge of how to use sewing tools, cutting shapes and patterns, and creating simple projects. This fun and beneficial class not only will teach children the importance of attention to detail and patience, but also pride in creating a project with their own hands.

(7 weeks - \$324)

Friday - The Art of Storytelling, Grades 2-4

From oral histories to modern podcasts, explore how the art of storytelling has shaped our world. As children learn about different methods of storytelling, they will practice creating and telling stories of their own. This will culminate with an audio "book" of stories performed by LES students.

Session 3

JANUARY - FEBRUARY

Monday - ImagArena, K-Grade 1

ImagArena combines the spirit of an art program, the materials of a building workshop, and the framework of a video game to provide an experience that engages everyone. In this class taught by a LES teacher you will participate in design challenges, building activities, craft projects, and more!

(6 weeks - \$244)

Tuesday - Art with Pam, K-Grade 1

Thursday - LES Ski Club, K-Grade 8

Skiing down the slopes with your friends is a fun way to spend your winter days. Learn to ski or just fine tune your skills. After a fun afternoon of skiing, you will return to Lesley Ellis School at 7:00 p.m. Lift ticket, lesson and transportation for six weeks are included. Equipment rental is available for an additional fee (\$125). *Please note: Fitting for rental equipment is will be in September 2019.

Frequently Asked Questions

How does a session work?

Each session begins on the first of the month, and continues until the last day. For example, Session 1 ends on Thursday, October 31. Session 2 then begins immediately on Friday, November 1.

What are the hours of Clubhouse?

Clubhouse begins at 3:15 and ends at 5:30. Parents are welcome to pick up their child at any time. A late fee will be assessed for children picked up after 5:30.

How do I register my child?

Parents may enroll in Clubhouse by going to our website www.lesleyellis.org and click on Auxiliary Programs. Parents may enroll their child on a session-by-session basis or for the full school year.

What if something unexpectedly comes up?

If you unexpectedly need care during the afternoon you can enroll in Extended Hours.

What if my student does not like the Workshop after they are enrolled?

Each Workshop last several weeks. Because we have to guarantee a minimum amount of students you would be obligated for the fees for the Workshop. We suggest that you talk with your student before enrolling in a Workshop.

What if I need after school care but don't want my student to participate in a Clubhouse Workshop?

Students are always welcome to join us in Clubhouse. We will always have something fun to do, and they will have plenty of friends to play alongside.

Can my student go to the Clubhouse and to a Clubhouse Workshop?

Your student can select Clubhouse or a Clubhouse Workshop on any day during each session. You will need to choose before the Clubhouse Workshop begins, but you can attend Clubhouse for one session and a Clubhouse Workshop in another session. No worries!
